Sun Valley Blvd Corridor Improvements Project

Project Overview

The Sun Valley Corridor Improvements Project is a proposed \$87 million infrastructure upgrade focused on Sun Valley Boulevard from Scottsdale Road to 7th Avenue. The project is led by the Regional Transportation Commission (RTC) of Washoe County in collaboration with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT), and Washoe County. Construction is anticipated to begin in 2027.

Project Purpose

Sun Valley Boulevard serves one of the highest transit ridership areas in the region and includes a segment identified on the High Injury Network, where a significant percentage of severe crashes have occurred. In addition:

- Pedestrian and bicycle facilities are limited or not ADA-compliant.
- Existing roadside drainage ditches are undersized and contribute to recurring flooding.
- Flooding affects pedestrian access and transit stops.
- The current drainage system prevents safe and complete roadway improvements.
- This project addresses long-standing safety, accessibility, and drainage challenges in the corridor.

The goal is to create a safer, more resilient, and more accessible corridor for all users.

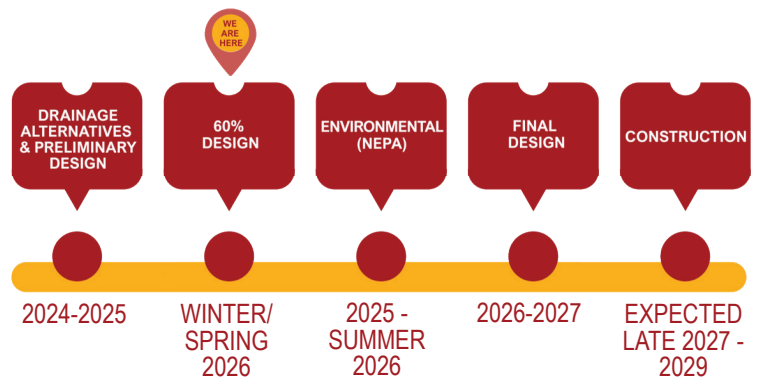
Funding

- The project is currently funded through RTC Fuel Tax and Federal contributions
- The RTC is seeking additional grant funding

Proposed Improvements

- ADA compliant sidewalks and shared-use paths
- Flashing beacon pedestrian crossings at key locations
- Transit stop enhancements with shelters and benches
- Median and signal improvements to improve safety
- New storm drain infrastructure within the roadway
- Upstream detention to temporarily store stormwater and reduce peak runoff during large storm events
- Downstream channel improvements near Rampion Way
- Pedestrian-scale lighting along the shared-use path
- Retaining walls in select areas to support grading and roadway improvements
- Landscape monument features and xeriscape plantings

Schedule



The project is currently at 60% design and progressing through the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process.
